PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Littlemore has two new items of infrastructure organised & funded (or part-funded) by Littlemore Parish Council.

- A Bus Information Display screen is live & working at the bus stop outside the Littlemore Mental Health Centre on Sandford Road.
- The CCTV camera is now fully functioning beside the shops on Cowley Road: it was part-funded by a Thames Valley Police grant.

At the September parish council

meeting there were planning applications from 18 Denny Gardens & 38 Minchery Road: the council had no objections to either. Oxford City Council has informed the parish council that the application for 12 Pipley Fulong has been refused while those for 12 Rahere Road, 244 Herschel Crescent & 15 Rahere Road have all been approved.

There are currently two vacancies on the parish council which were scheduled to be filled by co-option at the September meeting. However, there was an internal administrative issue which needs to be resolved before any co-options can be made. These were therefore deferred until the next meeting, by which time the issue will be resolved.

Cllr Peter George, chair of Littlemore Parish Council, is organising a meeting between parish councillors and the city council about the development in Railway Lane.

The Littlemore Parish Council Fun Day in Oxford Road Recreation Ground is scheduled for Saturday 27 September from noon until 4pm. Many activities will be available: climbing wall, go-carts, bouncy castle and much more. On show at the event will be the proposed designs for new play equipment for Ox Rd Rec, for parishioners to view provide feedback.

Oxford City Cllr Stares and County Cllr Henwood are in discussions with the Peabody Trust regarding the need for a play area to serve the housing estate along Armstrong Road. This is ongoing but looks positive.

Tony Eaude, chair of the Littlemore Neighbourhood Plan Working Group, briefed the Council on the plan. The independent examiner made one or two points about strategic objectives and community aspirations. However, the Plan was ultimately approved to go forward to referendum which is anticipated to be in January 2026. Tony recommended that the Council create a robust campaign encouraging parishioners to vote in favour of adopting the plan. Thanks to Littlemore Arts Hub, for empowering Littlemore

On 6 September, I had the pleasure of joining the Littlemore Arts Hub for their Visual Arts Workshop at St Mary & St Nicholas Church. It was fantastic to see our community come together to enjoy a creative afternoon in such a welcoming space. Thank you to Alex Singleton and all the volunteers who made it happen. Your dedication brings colour, connection, and joy to Littlemore. I'm proud to sponsor this grassroots initiative. Its next 2 workshops focus on Window Art, ahead of the Littlemore window Walkabout (see pp 2, 4 & flier p 15). Let's keep the creativity flowing!

Cllr Andrew Gant's visit during the closure of Oxford Road The road is shut while Energetic Electricity installs high-voltage ducts to strengthen our local power network. Like my Councillor colleagues, I've been out monitoring the morning traffic. To find practical solutions, I arranged a meeting on Friday 12 Sept from 7.15 to 8.15am between Oxfordshire Highways Officer Phil Whitfield, Cllr Andrew Gant, Cabinet Member for Transport Management, and fellow councillors Anne Stares and David Henwood. Although the peak congestion began around 8.10 - just as the visit was ending, I shared a video showing the full extent of the traffic jam on other days. It stretched from Newman Road almost to Littlemore Church. Both Cllr Gant and Officer Whitfield listened attentively, welcomed community input, and committed to reviewing the proposals put forward. If feasible, they promised swift action to ease the disruption.

- Residents' Voices Matter: several residents took the opportunity to share their concerns directly with the visiting officials. Issues raised included:
- · Repainting white lines near the Cowley Rd chicane, to prevent parking that blocks visibility for residents leaving
- · Safety concerns at the Newman Road junction with Iffley Rd.
- · The ongoing pressure on Oxford Road, with calls for longterm solutions.
- · Mixed views on Low Traffic Neighbourhoods (LTNs), reflecting the diversity of opinion in the community.
- · Increased traffic volume causing delays on the Ring Road.
- · Parking congestion on Sandford Road especially during school drop-off & pick-up times.

Data and Next Steps:

Phil Whitfield shared preliminary traffic data and committed to preparing a comprehensive traffic analysis for Littlemore, which will help shape practical solutions. The team also proposed regular follow-up visits with Oxfordshire Highways and Cllr Gant to develop a shared vision for the future of transport in Littlemore. Cllr Gant agreed to attend future sessions.

Cllr Gant requested a formal proposal outlining the community's needs. In response, we are preparing a detailed document that will include:

- · A full list of traffic and highways concerns.
- · Proposals for advance planning and mitigation measures for any future roadworks.
- · A collaborative approach involving Parish, City, and County Councillors for any future roadworks to mitigate traffic issues.

This initiative is about more than traffic: it's about collaboration, resilience, and standing up for our community. We want to hear from you. RECYCLING REMINDERS for those who use sacks not bins

Around March/April and again around September/October, free supplies of clear recycling sacks, and lilac rubbish sacks are delivered to properties that cannot accommodate wheelie bins. Residents don't need to order the sacks, as they are automatically delivered to eligible properties.

The supplies are calculated to last for three sacks per collection, so they add up to the same capacity as a 240-litre bin.

A huge thank you to all households recycling with sacks – your efforts have helped Oxfordshire become the best in England for recycling, reusing, and composting for the 10th year in a row, with residents recycling an impressive 57.2% of household waste.

Quick reminders:

- · Clear sacks (for recycling) and lilac sacks (for rubbish) are provided free if your property can't fit a wheelie bin.
- · Crews will never take more than three <u>lilac</u> sacks per collection.
- · If you have extra recycling, please use unbranded clear sacks (available from supermarkets or online).
- · If you have any doubt about what goes in recycling, consult the Waste Wizard which will also give advice about recycling items that the County Council cannot take.



Washable (reusable) nappies are made of bamboo, hemp, cotton or microfibre. A baby needs only around 20 to 30 of them: they can save parents several hundred pounds with their first baby, and even more if re-used for subsequent children.

- The Reusable Nappy Week website has a guide on sizes, materials and how to get started.
- The Oxon Cloth Nappy Library has a loan scheme.



PLANNING MATTERS

- Community Infrastructure Levy: City Council has approved an increase for new office, and research & development buildings, including labs. From 15 August, the rate rose from £33.74 per m² to £172.28 per m². CIL is a planning charge used to fund infrastructure. A small amount of the money goes to the immediate neighbourhood, but this will increase if our Neighbourhood Plan is adopted.
- Proposal to introduce **new double yellow lines** following complaints, & site visits by Highways officers. Locations: Alice Smith Square, Railway Lane, Sandford Road, and Bampton Close (see maps, right). Consultation opened & closed between issues of LITTLEMORE LOCAL. See the next issue for updates.
- 8 Lanham Way: 25/01546/FUL: Demolition of existing detached building & garage. Erection of 4 x 2 bed houses & 4 x 1 bed flats. This is a house at the far end of Lanham Way, next to the 10 new affordable homes built by the Council. The application was listed and closed for comments in the window between issues of LITTLEMORE LOCAL. The most serious reasons for objection were well covered by the Parish Council, and by local residents (who reported that the land was protected from development by a covenant).
- Ozone Leisure Park: 25/01588/FUL: Demolition of existing buildings then a phased redevelopment of the site with mixed use R&D laboratories, restoration of Grade II* Listed Minchery Priory, construction of community leisure building, and Cowley Branch Line mobility hub, etc. Though there has been some preliminary public consultation, this application was listed and will be closed for formal comments in the window between issues of LITTLEMORE LOCAL. At the time of writing, local residents, BBL Parish Council and Oxford Preservation Trust have objected. There is a concern that the proposals for the Grade II* Minchery Farmhouse lack detail. Firoka has failed to keep to the original agreement for maintaining it: this is an opportunity to right this: OPT suggests that its sensitive restoration should be a focal point and not an afterthought.
- Plot 27 Oxford Science Park: 22/02555/FUL: Development of a laboratory and office building with associated access road, landscaping, car parking, cycle parking, site infrastructure and engineering works and related works. This application was approved on August 14.
- On 14 August Cherwell District Council's Planning Committee approved Oxford United's application for a new stadium.
 The Kassam Stadium and some of its car parks are already earmarked for development.
- Dominion Oil site Railway Lane: scaffolding is off the first 24 houses of this development, which may be occupied for social rent in early 2026. The 100% affordable development will provide 47 social rent and 43 shared ownership homes with 0.4 parking spaces per household.
- Work has started on 51 new homes at the Northfield Hostel site off Sandy Lane West. These shared ownership & social rent homes are being built by OX Place, working with Equans.
- Oxrail 2040 and the Cowley Branch Line: County Council has published its plans to improve rail transport across the county over the next 15 years. Details, and a survey (open for replies until 23.59 on Wednesday 1 Oct 2025), are available at https://letstalk.oxfordshire.gov.uk/oxrail-2040. They include the plans to re-open the Cowley Branch line to passenger traffic. Previous consultations have suggested that there will

be no parking at the station, but there will be vehicular access via Oxford and Newman Roads, and therefore Champion





Way and St Nicks, Giles, Priory & Minchery Roads with the max impact on Priory & Minchery whose residents may see little benefit from a train to Marylebone, and where, unless something is done to prevent it we may expect drops offs & turning. It has been proposed that the whole of Littlemore will have to be residents-only parking. Funding for re-opening the Cowley Branch Line to passenger traffic is not yet in place: though the Ellison Institute and other labs already in the pipeline are pushing very hard for the stations, money will have to come from developments yet to be agreed/ completed, like the 3000 houses in Sandford, other thousands round Grenoble Road and on Sandy Lane Sports Ground, replacement of the Ozone Leisure Centre with (mostly) lab space, and the replacement of Kassam stadium and its car parks with housing (ie loss of most of Littlemore's potential leisure space).

ELLISON INSTITUTE NEWS

LITTLEMORE LOCAL has learnt that Professor Sir John Bell has stepped down as the first President of EIT , and that the University of Oxford has launched a new AI vaccine research program with EIT . We don't yet have news about the ways in which EIT will benefit Littlemore, but the build in Littlemore is due for completion in 2027, and will comprise: 30,000m² of research laboratories, plus an oncology and preventative care clinic, with educational & meeting space.
