Littlemore Parish Council is seeking a highly motivated, committed, professional for the position of Parish Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer (RFO). (25 hours per week, Monday to Friday working flexibly).

Littlemore is a pleasant urban parish on the southern border of Oxford City which includes an attractive Conservation Area, an expanding Science Park and several business premises; two small green spaces and A parks which provide children's play facilities. There are approximately 6,230 residents in 2,037 dwellings with high pockets of deprivation and associated problems.

Littlemore Parish Council is an Oxford Living Wage Employer.

The parish council has 16 councillors and a precept of £85,609. The parish clerk line manages 3 ground maintenance employees and the editor of the Littlemore Local newsletter.

The parish clerk will be responsible for all day-to-day management, administrative support and advice to the council on legal, personnel, planning and regulatory matters relating to council business. The Clerk takes instructions from the council as a body with the council taking responsibility on all decisions. The position offers the option for home working, requiring attendance at a minimum of two evenings meeting each month and occasional day time meeting and onsite visits. The successful candidate will have previous management experience, excellent inter-personal communication and organisation skills. The ability to work independently is essential, as is competency in using Microsoft products.

As **Responsible Financial Officer** the successful candidate will manage the Council's financial affairs. They will have experience of financial/accounting practices including receipt and expenditure bookkeeping, VAT, and the ability to prepare budgets, accounts, manage the councils' assets, insurance, links to payroll, audit process and use of accounting software.

Preferred Applications will hold the Certificate in Local Council Administration (CiLCA). Although other relevant professional qualifications will be considered.

Experience in local government and formal committee work would be an advantage.

The Council supports continual professional development through funding.

The place of employment is Littlemore with the option of homeworking, to be agreed between employer and successful candidate.

The starting salary is LC2 SPC 29 – 32 (£39,862 - £42,839 pro rata), dependent on skills, qualifications and experience. The Local Government Pension Scheme is offered, plus a working from home allowance is payable, if appropriate, office equipment is provided. Travelling allowance is provided if needed.

About Littlemore Parish Council

Littlemore Parish Council (LPC) is the most local level of elected representation. Its aim is to serve as a vehicle of local opinion; to provide an effective link between the residents and both Oxford City Council and Oxfordshire County Council; to express local feelings and interests and to keep watch on all developments within the parish. The Council has a good record of delivering well-respected services and facilities which contribute considerably to the life of the parish.

LPC lies within Oxford city boundary, one of four parishes within the city, with a population of 6,230. It is characterised by a mix of large and small dwellings and includes the Oxford Science Park. The parish, like most areas, continues to grow as housing demand increases. Although it does have a conservation area and a Neighbourhood Plan.

LPC is composed of 16 seats and currently has 15 members. The parish is divided into three wards: Bodley Road (two seats), Littlemore (thirteen seats) and Sandy Lane West (one seat). The Council has a Chair and Vice Chair, who are elected each May at the Annual Meeting of the Council.

All councillors meet as the Full Council once a month, excluding August. These meetings are open to the public and are held on the second Tuesday of the month. The Council also has three committees and groups: Personnel & Standards, Finance and General Purposes and Parks & Environment. All planning applications are reviewed in the full council meetings. The Council's agendas and minutes are available on the Council's website.

The Council provides a range of services and facilities including playing fields, playgrounds and various pockets on green spaces.

The Council is supported by a small team of grounds staff who report to the Clerk. The Parish Clerk's role is to give advice, implement decisions, manage day-to-day delivery of services and to manage the finances.

Littlemore Parish Council are a Certified Oxford Living Wage employer.

Littlemore Parish Council is also a Civility & Respect Pledge Council.

There are two Parliamentary Constituencies in the area:
Oxford East – The current MP is the Rt. Hon. Anneliese Dodds and
Oxford West & Abingdon – The current MP is the Rt. Hon. Layla Moran.

The Post

The vacancy is for Clerk & Responsible Financial Officer with duties according to the job description below. This is a permanent post, but confirmation of the appointment will be subject to satisfactory completion of a period of probationary service of six months. The Scheme of Conditions of Service of the National Joint Council for Local Government Services (The “Green Book”) will apply to the employment (except as amended by contract – if you need further information on this point please ask).

The usual place of work will be the Parish Office in Littlemore.

The salary is as advertised; normal advancement on the scale is by annual increment (subject to satisfactory performance) but no candidate will achieve the top increment of the scale without the Certificate of Local Council Administration (CiLCA); an individual who achieves CiLCA while in post will be advanced one increment in recognition of that achievement.

Salary will be paid monthly by direct transfer on the last Friday of each month.

Hours of work will be 25 hours per week normally to be worked over five days – Monday to Friday but including some evening working for Council/Committee meetings. The Council is well disposed to these hours being worked flexibly, but this needs to be balanced with maintaining a public-facing service so must be available to the public (via telephone, email or in person by arrangement); the extent of flexible working can be the subject of negotiation if an offer of employment is made.

Annual leave will be 23 days a year rising to 26 days after five years’ service. In addition to normal bank and public holidays, you will be entitled to two extra statutory days.

The Council is a member of the Local Government Pension Scheme (LGPS). You will be auto enrolled into the scheme, and your employee contributions will be made by deduction from salary. LGPS is a defined benefit scheme and more information may be found here:

Parish Clerk/ RFO - Job Description

The Clerk to the Parish Council will be both the Proper Officer of the Council and also Responsible Financial Officer and as such, is under a statutory duty to properly discharge its functions, to serve or issue all the notifications required by law. The Clerk will be totally responsible for ensuring that the instructions of the Council are carried out. The Clerk takes instructions from the Council as a body with the Council taking responsibility for all decisions.

The Clerk is expected to advise the Council on, and assist in the formation of, overall policies to be followed in respect of the authority's activities and to produce all the information required to enable the Council to make informed, effective decisions and to implement constructively all decisions. This may involve legal, personnel, planning and other relevant matters.

The Clerk is accountable to the Council for the effective management of all its resources and will report to the Council as and when required. The Clerk will be the Responsible Finance Officer and responsible for all financial records of the council and the careful administration of its finances.

Clerk

Specific Responsibilities

- a) Daily, to act as the first point of contact for anyone trying to communicate with the Parish Council with a problem or enquiry, either by phone or email. To take appropriate action immediately to encourage an open, honest and prompt interaction with the public at large. To deal with any other matters which may arise from time to time.
- b) To ensure that statutory and other provisions governing the operation of the Council are observed.
- c) To ensure monitor and review the Council's Standing Orders.
- d) As the responsible officer for GDPR, ensure adherence to General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) legislation in all areas of the Parish Council's work.
- e) To develop and implement an effective management system of manual and computerised records.
- f) As the responsible officer for FOI, respond to all Freedom of Information (FOI) requests.
- g) To encourage and monitor adherence to the Council's Code of Conduct, especially embracing the Nolan Principles, and advise the Chairman of any issues accordingly.
- h) To work in conjunction with the Chairman regarding Press releases and use of the Council's social media.
- i) To ensure that the Council's obligations for Risk Assessment throughout the estate are properly met and act as the Council's Health and Safety Officer.
- j) To prepare, in consultation with appropriate Members, agenda and reports for meetings of the Council and its committees; to attend such meetings and prepare Minutes for approval.
- k) To attend all meetings of the Council and all meetings of committees and working groups. other than where such duties have been delegated to another member of staff.

- l) To receive and process correspondence and documents on behalf of the Council and, as necessary, bring such items to the attention of the Council. To issue correspondence because of the instructions of, or the known policy of the Council.
- m) To study reports and other data on activities of the Council and on matters bearing on those activities. Where appropriate, to discuss such matters with administrators and specialists in particular fields and produce reports for circulation and discussion by the Council.
- n) To draw up both on their initiative, and because of suggestions by councillors, proposals for consideration by the Council and to advise on practicability and the likely effects of specific courses of action.
- o) To supervise all other members of staff as their line manager in keeping with the policies of the council and to undertake all necessary activities in connection with the management of salaries, conditions of employment and work of other staff. To undertake annual appraisals of all staff and where necessary, arrange appropriate training.
- p) To lead on projects, maintenance/monitoring tasks and other reasonable duties, as required
- q) To monitor the implemented policies of the Council to ensure they are achieving the desired result, and where appropriate, suggest modifications.
- r) To act as a representative of the Council as required.
- s) To act as Office Manager, developing and improving internal office systems, including IT, as situations demand, to ensure the smooth running of all administrative and financial functions.
- t) To monitor content on the Parish Council website and social media instructing updates as necessary.
- u) To issue notices and prepare agenda and minutes for the Annual and Parish Council meetings and to attend these.
- v) To prepare, in consultation with the Chairman, press releases about the activities of, or decisions of the Council. If necessary, arrange printing, distribution and posting on noticeboards.

Responsible Finance Officer

The Responsible Finance Officer is appointed in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act 1972, section 151

Specific Responsibilities

- a) To monitor compliance with the Parish Council's Financial Regulations.
- b) To manage risk faced by the Council and to recommend such insurance as required eg Public Liability, Employers Liability, Vehicle and Fidelity?
- c) To prepare financial reports of the Council covering preparation of the Budget, budget monitoring, fund balances, receipts and payments to date, payroll summary, payment of invoices, and other relevant current matters. This includes AGAR, Audits and VAT.
- d) To receive and report on invoices for goods and services to be paid for by the Council and ensure such accounts are met. In a timely fashion to issue invoices on behalf of the Council, for goods and services and ensure payment is received.
- e) To prepare draft estimates which, when approved, will form the annual budget for the year, and to report thereon, as necessary.
- f) To submit the Precept to the Oxford City Council at the correct date and to provide any figures required for inclusion in the Council Tax Bill information as required by statute.
- g) To bank regularly all money received by the Council.
- h) To monitor all Parish Council bank balances to ensure the accounts are viable. This may include periodic monitoring with a named councillor.
- i) To ensure that all money due to the Council is billed and collected promptly.
- j) To identify the duties of all staff dealing with financial matters and to ensure, wherever possible, the segregation of duties of staff, thus facilitating as much internal control as possible. If staff are not appropriate for such internal controls, then to involve Members in the internal control systems wherever possible.
- k) To manage the cash-flow and to control investments and bank transfers.
- l) To control all payments within the financial budget resources of the Council.
- m) To ensure all payroll information is sent to external Payroll Services on time or to take overall responsibility for the management of the payroll, ensuring prompt and proper payment of any deductions for Income Tax, National Insurance and pension fund or superannuation fund contributions.
- n) To take overall responsibility for the prompt submission of VAT Return Forms and repayment claims.
- o) To verify, analyse for accounting purposes, and to authorise/recommend for payment invoices from suppliers.
- p) To prepare Financial Statements for each financial year for Councillors and the public.

- q) To arrange for the appropriate Internal Audit in accordance with Financial Regulations.
- r) To prepare the Final Accounts and the Annual Return for the Council each year and to submit them to Council for approval and to the Auditor when required.
- s) To maintain and review the Council's Asset register.

Professional Development

- a) Maintain the status of Qualified Clerk/RFO as a minimum requirement of effectiveness within the role of Clerk to the Council
- b) To attend training courses relating to the role and the work of the Clerk/RFO
- c) To continue to acquire the necessary professional knowledge required for the efficient management of the affairs of the Council. Membership of the professional body The Society of Local Council Clerks (SLCC) will be paid for by the Council.
- d) If required by the Parish Council, to attend the Annual Conference of the National Association of Local Councils (NALC); Society of Local Council Clerks (SLCC) and other relevant bodies as a representative of the Parish Council.

To undertake from time to time, any other responsibilities and functions, as requested by the Council commensurate with the responsibilities and duties of the post.

GDPR Privacy Notice for all Job Applicants

Introduction

As part of any recruitment process, Littlemore Parish Council collects and processes personal data relating to job applicants. The organisation is committed to being transparent about how it collects and uses that data and to meeting its data protection obligations under the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR).

The purpose of this privacy notice is to make all job applicants aware of how and why we collect and use your personal information, both during and after a job application process.

What information does the organisation collect?

The organisation collects a range of information about you. This includes:

- your name, address, and contact details, including email address and telephone number.
- details of your qualifications, skills, experience, and employment history.
- information about your current level of remuneration.
- whether or not you have a disability for which the organisation needs to make reasonable adjustments during the recruitment process.
- information about your entitlement to work in the UK; and
- equal opportunities monitoring information.

The organisation collects this information in a variety of ways. For example, data might be contained in application forms, CVs, obtained from your passport or other identity documents, or collected through interviews or other forms of assessment.

The organisation will also collect personal data about you from third parties, such as references supplied by former employers, information from employment background check providers including information from criminal records checks. The organisation will seek information from third parties only once a provisional job offer to you has been made and will inform you that it is doing so.

Data will be stored in a range of different places, including on your application record, in HR management systems and on other IT systems (including email).

Why does the organisation process personal data?

The organisation needs to process data to take steps at your request prior to entering a contract with you. It also needs to process your data to enter a contract with you. In some cases, the organisation needs to process data to ensure that it is complying with its legal obligations. For example, it is required to check a successful applicant's eligibility to work in the UK before employment starts.

The organisation has a legitimate interest in processing personal data during the recruitment process and for keeping records of the process. Processing data from job applicants allows the organisation to manage the recruitment process, assess and confirm a candidate's suitability for employment and decide to whom to offer a job. The organisation may also need to process data from job applicants to respond to and defend against legal claims.

Littlemore Parish Council relies on legitimate interests as a reason for processing data and has considered whether those interests are overridden by the rights and freedoms of employees or workers and has concluded that they are not.

The organisation processes health information if it needs to make reasonable adjustments to the recruitment process for candidates who have a disability. This is to carry out its obligations and exercise specific rights in relation to employment.

For some roles, the organisation is obliged to seek information about criminal convictions and offences. Where the organisation seeks this information, it does so because it is necessary for it to carry out its obligations and exercise specific rights in relation to employment.

The organisation will not use your data for any purpose other than the recruitment exercise for which you have applied.

Who has access to data?

Your information will be shared internally for the purposes of the recruitment exercise. This includes members of the Council, interviewers involved in the recruitment process, managers in the department with a vacancy and IT contractors if access to the data is necessary for the performance of their roles.

The organisation will not share your data with third parties unless your application for employment is successful and it makes you an offer of employment.

The organisation will not transfer your data outside the European Economic Area.

How does the organisation protect data?

The organisation takes the security of your data seriously. It has internal policies and controls in place to ensure that your data is not lost, accidentally destroyed, misused, or disclosed, and is not accessed except by our employees in the proper performance of their duties.

For how long does the organisation keep data?

If your application for employment is unsuccessful, the organisation will hold your data on file for six months after the end of the relevant recruitment process. If your application for employment is successful, personal data gathered during the recruitment process will be transferred to your personnel file and retained during your employment.

Your rights

As a data subject, you have a number of rights. You can:

- access and obtain a copy of your data on request.
- require the organisation to change incorrect or incomplete data.
- require the organisation to delete or stop processing your data, for example where the data is no longer necessary for the purposes of processing.
- object to the processing of your data where the organisation is relying on its legitimate interests as the legal ground for processing; and
- ask the organisation to stop processing data for a period if data is inaccurate or there is a dispute about whether your interests override the organisation's legitimate grounds for processing data.

What if you do not provide personal data?

You are under no statutory or contractual obligation to provide data to the organisation during the recruitment process. However, if you do not provide the information, the organisation may not be able to process your application properly or at all.
