Listening to Your Concerns

During the campaign, I spoke with many of you and heard several consistent issues:

- **Potholes:** Widespread frustration over the condition of our local roads.
- **Roundabout Flags:** Strong concerns that the flags at the Littlemore roundabout do not reflect a welcoming, united community and are causing distress for many residents.
- **Bus Services:** Despite some improvements, reliability remains an issue. You highlighted the need to bring back routes (like X40 via Iffley Road) and improve evening provision, as the last city centre bus at 22:45 makes night travel very difficult.

While roads and transport fall under Oxfordshire County Council, I am fighting your corner. I have already emailed their new Oxfordshire Cabinet Members regarding these exact issues and will work hard to ensure your voices are heard.
